Tartan High Hosts Relay for Life at Oak Meadows

Anyone driving by Oak Meadows last fall might have wondered what was going on when they saw our seniors making laps around an illuminated parking lot with their friends, families and the students from Tartan High School. Tartan hosted their first off-campus Relay for Life in support of the American Cancer Society at Oak Meadows. When our tenants learned that Tartan was #2 in the nation in fundraising and were shooting for #1, we wanted to help. Tenants purchased and decorated luminary bags and then walked the illuminated track. There was an extraordinary level of participation for the event! Over \$650 was raised for Tartan's Relay for Life and the tenants were thrilled to be able to participate and create an even stronger relationship with the students at Tartan.



Veterans Recognized by Lake Elmo Historical Society

Three members of the greatest generation, World War II Veterans Roy Thomson, Pearl Hughes and Matt Sprangers, gave living histories of their military service in interviews sponsored by the Lake Elmo Historical Society. They also had the opportunity to take part in the 2010 Honor Flight program, flying to Washington DC to tour the memorials in a whirlwind one-day trip. Roy, Pearl and Matt have been dedicated to serving others throughout their lives, and have continued to do so at Oak Meadows, with all of them serving in different officer roles on our Tenant Council. We are proud of all of our veterans!

It Started with a Class on Aging

Twelve years ago, our Marketing Manager, Kim Prayrock, taught a class on aging to second graders at Mounds Park Academy. Little did she know that one class started a long and growing tradition! Each May, to recognize Older Americans month, the second graders at Mounds Park write and illustrate their own book about aging and give them as gifts to our tenants. As third and fourth graders, they return to Oak Meadows to put on a music program and most importantly, renew the friendships forged with the tenants—many of whom keep the books for years.

But wait, there's more! One of the Mounds Park teachers has since moved to Nativity school in St. Paul as has brought Kim's aging class to her first graders. "It's been great," says Kim. "The kids at Nativity make seasonal decorations for our tenants and pray for us every day. When the kids come to play bingo and meet our tenants, they are able to see all of their wonderful gifts lovingly displayed on the doors throughout Oak Meadows."

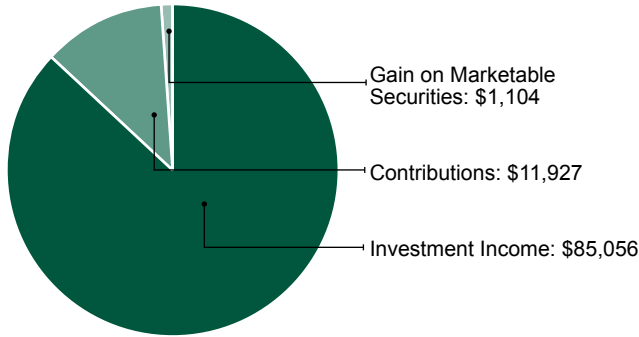
The Oak Meadows Mission

Our mission is to provide a dignified living environment which embodies God's love for all, and is dedicated to the well being of our tenants, their families and our staff.

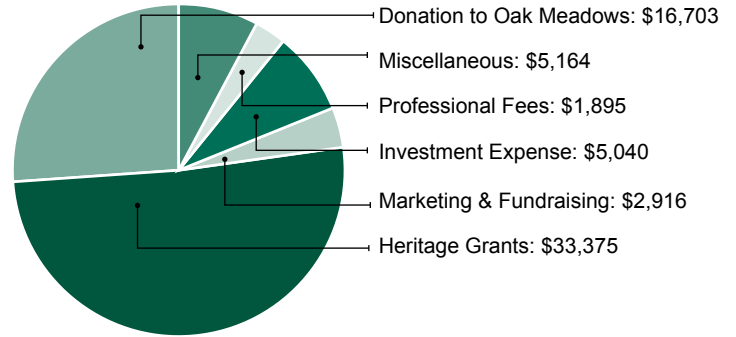

Total: \$98,087

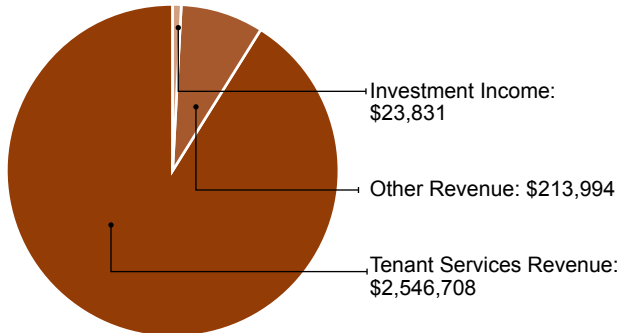


Expenditures
Total: \$65,093

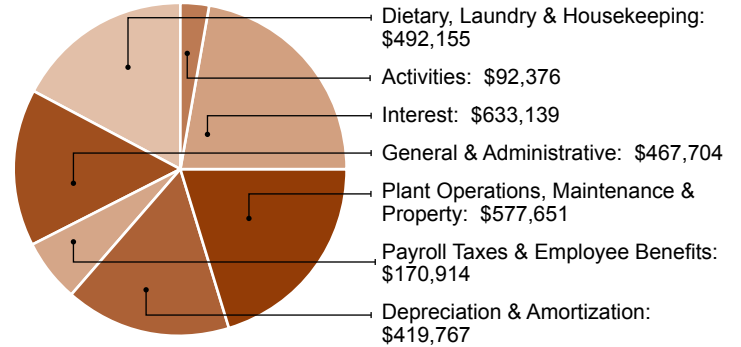


Oak Meadows
